# **English Activities**

### **Daily Morning Assembly**

As students are listening to the two student presenters accompanied by the NET, all S1 and S2 students

receive a copy of the script and need to fill in the blanks while listening. Keywords are posted up in all S1 to S3 homeroom classrooms, so students are able to use these words they have learned during morning assembly and incorporate them into their daily life.



### Weekly S1-S2 Reading Aloud - Every Thursday during Lunchtime

S1 and S2 students are all given a copy of the Reading Aloud booklet that covers new and trendy issues on topics that are facing our society today. Our NET pre-records each text, so students are able to log on and listen to the reading texts on E-class. This program helps build students' oral competence as well as confidence in speaking to different teachers and student ambassadors. It is hoped that students will be trained to be competent language users.
